Short listing criteria for admission to Ph.D. programme at KSBS

The following short-listing criteria was decided by the DRC, KSBS for the selection of Ph.D. students for semester I, 2024-25.

Exemptions, relaxations and clarifications

For SC/ST/PwD category candidates, a relaxation of 5% marks or 0.5 CGPA is allowed in the qualifying degree performance (Sr. No. 1, 2, & 3). Further, 5% marks or 0.5 CGPA is relaxed at all previous career levels (class XII to pre-qualifying exam) for these applicants (Not applicable in case of CFTI waiver **).

1. Qualifying degree performance in case of candidates, who are in their final year of qualifying degree, will be computed as per IIT Delhi guidelines. Their admission would be provisional, subject to meeting the minimum eligibility criteria set above.

2. Requirement of GATE/National Exams is waived for the following categories of applicants:

a) Currently registered students in Centrally Funded Technical Institutes (CFTIs) pursuing B.Tech./ B.E./ Integrated M.Tech./Integrated M.Sc. programmes, who have completed 6 semesters or more, and have CGPA of 8.000 or above (on a 10-point scale). Such students must obtain a CGPA of 8.000 or above at the time of graduation, and before they formally register for the Ph.D. programme (80% aggregate marks, if marks are the primary mode of evaluation);

b) Graduates of CFTIs (in the programmes marked under (1)) with a final graduation CGPA of more than 8.000 (80% aggregate marks, if marks are the primary mode of evaluation).

c) M.A. /M.Sc. from IITs with CGPA 8.0 or above.

3. In addition to the above, applicants must have first division/class throughout their academic career from Class XII onwards.

4. **Part-time and sponsored candidates:** Minimum qualification for these candidates is the same as that of the full-time candidates (refer Table 1), except that the requirement of qualifying in a national examination (column 4 in Table 1) is waived. Such candidates need a minimum total uninterrupted work experience of two years as on the date of registration. Part time and sponsored candidates must produce NOC/Sponsorship certificate at the time of interviews in the format specified in the Information Brochure of IIT Delhi.

*GATE score is relaxed in case of **OBC-NCL** and **SC/ST/PwD** candidates to \geq 495 and \geq 450, respectively.

** Relaxation is not applicable for the GATE score /national examination waiver for students from centrally funded technical institutions (CFTIs).

Short listing criteria for Admission to MS(R) Programme at KSBS

The following short-listing criteria was decided by the DRC, KSBS for the selection of MS(R) students for semester I, 2024-25.

Exemptions, relaxations and clarifications

1. For SC/ST/PwD category candidates, a relaxation of 5% marks or 0.5 CGPA is allowed in the qualifying degree performance (Sr. No. 1, 2, & 3). Further, 5% marks or 0.5 CGPA is relaxed at all previous career levels (from Class XII to Pre-qualifying exam) for these applicants.

2. Qualifying degree performance in case of candidates, who are in their final year of qualifying degree, will be computed as per IIT Delhi guidelines. Their admission would be provisional, subject to meeting the minimum eligibility criteria set above.

3. Requirement of GATE/National Exams is waived for the following categories of applicants:

a. Currently registered students in Centrally Funded Technical Institutes (CFTIs) pursuing B.Tech./B.E./ Integrated M.Tech./Integrated M.Sc./Dual programmes, who have completed 6 semesters or more, and have CGPA of 8.000 or above (on a 10-point scale). Such students must obtain a CGPA of 8.000 or above at the time of graduation, and before they formally register for the MS (R) programme (80% aggregate marks, if marks are the primary mode of evaluation);

b. Graduates of CFTIs (in the programmes marked under (a)) with a final graduation CGPA of more than 8.000(80% aggregate marks, if marks are the primary mode of evaluation).

c. MSc from IITs with CGPA 8.0 or above.

4. In addition to the above, the applicants must have first division/class throughout their academic career from Class XII onwards.

*GATE score is relaxed in case of **OBC-NCL** and **SC/ST/PwD** candidates to \geq **495** and \geq **450**, respectively.

**Institute criteria for foreign student admissions for semester I: 2024-2025 (Annexure
II C)**

Doctor of Philosophy (PhD):

Bachelor of Technology/Engineering (4 year or more) in relevant discipline with at least 70% marks OR Master of Technology/Engineering (2 year or more) in relevant discipline with at least 60% marks OR Master of Science/Arts (2 year or more) in relevant discipline with at least 60% marks.

Master of Technology (MTech)/Master of Science (Research)

Bachelor of Technology/Engineering (4 year or more) in relevant discipline with at least 60% marks OR Master of Science (at least 2 years) in related discipline with at least 60% marks.
Qualifying degree: The degree by virtue of which a candidate meets the eligibility criterion for a particular program.

NOTE:

1. All marks are aggregate for the entire duration of the program.
2. A GPA of 6.0 on a 10-point scale would be considered equivalent to 60%. Translation to other scales is done proportionally; thus 6.0 on a 10-point scale is equivalent to 2.4 on a 4-point scale.
3. non-Indian nationals who obtained their qualifying degree from an Institution in India will have to meet additional requirements applicable to Indian students.
